Climate change is an issue which will play a key role in business operations going forward. The Carbon Disclosure Project (CDP) offers a free half-day training for corporate environment, communications, purchasing and investor relations officers wishing to improve their understanding of how climate change will impact their business through customers, investors and suppliers as well as through increased carbon regulatory systems.

CDP is an independent not-for-profit organisation which holds the largest database of corporate climate change information in the world. The data is obtained from responses to CDP's annual Information Requests, issued on behalf of institutional investors, purchasing organisations and government bodies. Since its formation in 2000, CDP has become the gold standard for carbon disclosure methodology and process, providing primary climate change data to the global market place.

More than 5000 companies globally receive the CDP Information Requests and many companies already complete the Information Request, issued annually on behalf of customers and investors.

Attendance at these workshop will prepare you and help you prepare your company for the impacts of climate change, as well as informing on best practice in responding to the CDP Information Request.

The workshops are designed for any company already responding to CDP and for any company not yet responding, which may receive the Information Request this year for the first time.
